The story of the Amplifying Local Voices for Equitable Development (ALVED) project is not an ordinary story supported by numbers and other statistical data, but a story whose epilogue means a lot of new friendships and working collaboration experiences by which each participant improved themselves first of all, and then the community they live in. For almost three years (from September 2020 to March 2023), all generations of residents of Vranje, Bujanovac and Lebane collaborated and implemented **over 100 different activities**, often joined by the activists from Presevo who also made a great contribution to the overall results. The primary aim of these activities was to foster empathy among citizens in the south of Serbia, encourage active citizenship, and celebrate diversity.

The focus of the ALVED project was on three important areas: participatory planning of social services, the needs and concerns of young people, as well as strengthening local civil society organisations. **The total number of direct beneficiaries in all aspects of the project is close to 6,000**, but the number of people who have had an indirect benefit from the activities is far greater.

The project was successfully implemented in Serbia by a consortium led by the organisation Peaceful Change initiative (PCI), in close cooperation with People in Need (PIN) and in partnership with Civic Initiatives (CI), with funding provided by the Government of the United Kingdom.

In the following pages, we will present activities that are more than project activities, because for the ALVED team, and we hope for all the participants as well, they mean a small school of life that we went through together...

# COMMUNITIES OF EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

## Participatory Social Service Planning (PSSP)

is a collaborative approach to social service planning which involves all stakeholders in the local community - users of social services, civil society organisations, local authorities, government agencies, and social service providers. The main objective of the PSSP is to ensure that the needs and interests of the most vulnerable groups are taken into account in a transparent, systematic, and cooperative manner. The PSSP aims to alleviate poverty and prevent social exclusion by empowering

non-monetary support from the local self-governments of Vranje, Bujanovac and Lebane, as well as ALVED grants. The impact of the PSSP can be seen in the work of organisations such as **Association for Assistance to Mentally Underdeveloped Persons - MNRO** in Vranje, which provides crucial support to users with disabilities, such as multiple sclerosis, improving their quality of life and social status.

Similarly, the **Association Fenniks** in Lebane offers daycare services for children with developmental disabilities. Through cooperation with the municipality, a complete reconstruction of the daycare facility has begun, with the aim of maximising improvement and providing enriched resources for the children.



the most vulnerable groups to participate in political dialogue on issues of social protection and inclusion.

By including all parties in the planning process, the PSSP promotes a holistic approach to social protection, ensuring that no one is neglected in the global efforts to achieve sustainable development goals.

Since 2016, People in Need has been working in the EU neighbourhood, drawing experience from the Czech Republic and adapting it to the local context. As a result, the PSSP approach has been successfully implemented in the south of Serbia, in the municipalities of Vranje, Bujanovac and Lebane, leading to the adoption of three action plans for the improvement of social services.

Several organisations in these municipalities have successfully implemented elements of the action plans to provide high-quality social services, with financial, infrastructural and

## The Youth Forum for Education of Roma

in Bujanovac is dedicated to providing equal opportunities in education and social inclusion of vulnerable groups, such as poor families and the Roma

community, supporting children's education through financial assistance, free textbooks and incentives for regular attendance and academic performance.

Other organisations, such as the **Roma Cultural Centre** in Vranje, focus on the prevention of social dysfunction, while the **Human Rights Committee Vranje - SOS telephone** provides a reliable and sustainable SOS telephone to women who are victims of domestic violence. Similarly, the **Association of Roma Women** in Bujanovac has taken proactive measures to bridge the communication gap for victims of violence by hiring and training staff who can provide support in three languages: Serbian, Albanian and Roma.

The PSSP approach has had a positive impact on social protection services in Bujanovac, by creating a web page of the Centre for social work through the joint efforts of the **Association The Future**, the Municipality of Bujanovac, and the Centre for Social Work.

## Study visit to Prague

In order to further improve their efforts, representatives of all three municipalities participated in the study visit to the Czech Republic. Through interaction with local

experience have the capability to bring positive changes to the world. The PSSP approach has surely helped to improve social services in these municipalities and pointed out the importance of cooperation and inclusion in creating sustainable and influential programmes.





## WORKING WITH YOUNG PEOPLE IS THE HEART OF THE ALVED PROJECT

A particularly important and challenging part of the project was working with young people, considering that a significant number of young individuals got involved in all municipalities, **over 1300 of them**. We worked on some very important topics and covered

areas that will have a long-term effect on them, both as individuals and as members of activist groups, who would continue to strive to make the place they live in a better place for all its members. All activities with young people were organised on their initiative and based on their wishes and needs.

## Internships

An especially important part of the work with young people were the internships in civil society organisations and the media, which were organised for young individuals from Bujanovac, Vranje, Lebane, and Presevo in two cycles. Out of the 13 young people who completed the one-month or two-month internships, as many as **five of them managed to find a job** immediately after the end of the program. ## Study Visits: Belgrade and Pristina

The exchange of experiences, opinions and attitudes of young people from all municipalities is something ALVED insisted on, because by learning from each other, young people become more versatile and ready for life, but also for activism. The study visits of young people to **Belgrade in 2021** and **Pristina in 2022** were events that greatly marked the ALVED project. Young people from Presevo, Bujanovac, Lebane

and Vranje spent 5 days in Belgrade and 4 days in Pristina, getting to know the sights of the cities, but also learning a lot from each other about the Serbian and Albanian cultures. In both cities, young people visited civil society organisations working with young people, as well as cultural institutions and decision-makers who are important for the development of young people in every aspect.

Apart from that, we hosted young people from Pristina on a study visit to Belgrade.

## Local Youth Action Plan in Vranje

In order to systematically regulate youth work, there must be a strategic document that will ensure it. ALVED helped a group of young enthusiasts who wanted Vranje to adopt the Youth Action Plan again after six years. The members of the associations "Activists from the Neighbourhood", "Our world, our rules" and the Youth Office gathered together to, first of all, conduct research on the needs of young people, and later on, to adopt an official document, all the time professionally supported by a youth worker Ana Pecarski. With the support of the competent representatives of the local authorities, the Youth Action Plan was adopted at the end of 2021.

Working with young people in the south of Serbia resulted, among others, in the founding of a formal youth organisation in Bujanovac, “Youth Centre for Changes”, and an informal one in Lebane. A long-term cooperation between students’ parliaments of “Sveti Sava” and “Sezai Suroi” schools in Bujanovac was established, based on which they were also supported by an ALVED grant.

The innovative teaching methodology, One World in Schools (OWIS), uses documentaries and interactive methods to inspire and educate future generations of active and engaged citizens. Developed by People in Need, OWIS covers a range of important issues and is designed to encourage critical thinking and promote a deeper understanding of the world around us.

By being present in 16 schools throughout Vranje, Bujanovac, Lebane and Presevo, OWIS trained 47 teachers and was effectively implemented in both formal educational systems and community-based structures, such as youth centres, thus ensuring a wide reach and long-term sustainability.

OWIS is integrated into schools as an additional

tool to support civic education curricula. The programme includes 11 documentaries and accompanying teaching materials that provide a methodological basis for working with the audio-visual materials and creating an interactive space for learning about a range of important topics. These topics include environmental behaviour, food waste, migrations, propaganda and misinformation, social media and advertising, cyber security, social exclusion based on sexual orientation, social cohesion, multigenerational dialogue, volunteering and diversity.

Through its engaging and interactive approach, OWIS has the potential to improve and enrich students’ learning experience, helping to create a more informed, critical and active citizenry.

## OWIS outside the classroom

By empowering and inspiring young people to take action and initiate positive changes in their communities, OWIS goes beyond a simple documentary screening.

Inspired by the screenings of OWIS documentaries, the young citizens of Bujanovac organised an activity to promote social inclusion

for migrants. They wrote essays on the topic of the struggle and resilience of migrants and displayed them in the school hall for other students to read. In addition, they visited the **Presevo Reception Center** in order to connect with their peers and convey a message of support and acceptance.

Young people in Bujanovac launched an inspiring initiative to promote preventive health care measures and cooperation among Serbian, Albanian and Roma children. Through creative activities such as joint drawings and posters, **they successfully worked on raising awareness of the importance of preventive health care measures.** Additionally, they organised a lecture to highlight the connection between health and the environment.

in Vranje, Bujanovac and Lebane, presented the problems of mental health in a different and interesting way, encouraging young people to open up and share their thoughts and feelings.

## STRONG LOCAL CSOs = ACTIVE SOCIETY

PIN disbursed approximately **GBP 250,000** to grantees. There were **4,052 direct beneficiaries** of the grant projects.

PIN took a proactive approach to open communication in supporting these grassroots CSOs in improving their capacity to meet contractual requirements, including financial and narrative reporting, procurement of goods and services, as well as implementation, monitoring and evaluation activities. Another useful thing that ALVED leaves behind is the platform “Zemlja za nas”, which enables greater community participation in decision-making. It proved to be an effective tool for the municipalities of Vranje, Bujanovac and Lebane for conducting public consultations for action plans for social services.

This platform encourages interaction among community members, facilitating discussions on common concerns and generating solutions that can improve their environment. Through the “Zemlja za nas” platform, users can engage in various activities, including forums and polls, in order to give their opinion and collect feedback and community viewpoints.

**People in Need (PIN)** is a Czech non-governmental organisation (NGO) providing aid in troubled regions and supporting human rights since 1992. Since then, PIN has grown into one of the largest non-governmental organisations in Central and Eastern Europe. Today, its work focuses on humanitarian and development aid, advocacy for human rights and democratic freedoms, social work in the field and education, awareness raising and information. PIN addresses long-term problems in developing countries such as lack of safe water, food insecurity, environmental degradation and limited access to quality education and health services.

**PIN Western Balkans** is part of PIN's Relief and Development Department (RDD), which helps people in emergencies, conflict areas, areas affected by natural disasters and those living in extreme poverty.
